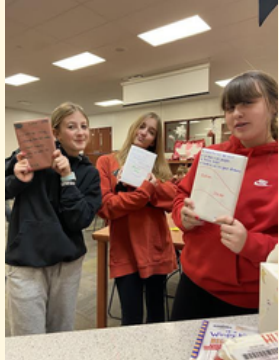


BLIND DATES! WITH BOOKS!

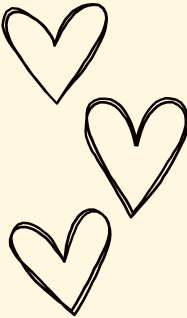
Mrs. Tucek's ELA class had mixed emotions about their Blind Dates!

On the page you will find a sample of the Acceptable Use Policy Agreement that was signed at the beginning of the school year. This document allowed BCS to assign your student(s) a Chromebook. It lays out the general conditions for participation. On this page, you can also read the Device Protection Program. This document explains what is covered when you pay for the school insurance for your student(s) device.

Please go over these documents and read them with your student(s). The IT Department is dealing **with an overwhelming amount of** computers being broken. Many of the damage is intentional. Keys are being pulled off and screens are being shattered by students shutting their devices while pencils are in them, slamming them down on desks, dropping them while in their binders, or just carelessly carrying them and dropping them.

Computers are such an important part of the school day. Please make sure that your student(s) understands the responsibility of owning a computer and the consequences for damaging it.
