

After graduating from Buchanan High School in 1977, Becky Gray studied mathematics & played field hockey & basketball at Kalamazoo College. While attending Kalamazoo College, Becky seized the opportunity to study abroad in Germany and earned a Rhodes Scholarship in 1981 to attend the University of Oxford, England. She was, at that time, the only student from the Southwestern, Michigan, area to become a Rhodes Scholar and would be the only for decades. She eventually earned a Master's and Doctorate degree in theology from Oxford and went on to become editor of Duke University's Evidence-based Practice Center.
