ICONIC AMERICA

Since November, 40 of the 7th graders, Mrs. Kratky, and Mrs. Luke have been participating in a fellowship with PBS and the Michigan Learning Channel. The group meets during Advisory on Monday and Tuesday morning for 30 jam-packed minutes. To begin, the group examined PBS' "Iconic America" series and learned about media production and the importance of storytelling. Afterward, they began taking steps to create their own mini documentaries on an iconic place in southwest Michigan. Initial thoughts were Lake Michigan, which posed a lot of transportation questions. Looking out her classroom window one afternoon, Mrs. Luke pondered, "What about the School Farm?," and the rest, as they say, is history! Mrs. Luke smiles when she shares the memory, "When we asked the students how they felt about making our documentaries about the School Farm, they were thrilled! 7th grade is when you really start to notice that transition from childhood to adulthood for some kids, but the childlike excitement to revisit a place they love couldn't be contained. The excitement was palpable!" Our students have been able to take a deep dive into the world of media production through this fellowship. PBS and the Michigan Learning Channel provided our students with a premium WeVideo account until July, and the fellowship gave Kratky and Luke over \$250 of media equipment each (microphones, tripods, lighting, charging blocks, and gimbals). Berrien RESA generously loaned the group a set of iPads to record b-roll and interviews. Currently, there are 9 documentary groups, but due to time constraints, Kratky and Luke are uncertain if all will be finished by the PBS and the Michigan Learning Channel's May 16 deadline. Even if they miss the PBS/MLC deadline, the students will continue working on their documentaries in order to post them to the School Farm webpage. "We did this for our community," says Mrs. Luke, "they're the ones who know how iconic our School Farm really is. The students have worked incredibly hard on this, and Mrs. Kratky and I are very proud of them. I think they're starting to realize what they're doing is a big deal; especially those who interviewed people at Plow Day. I'm excited to watch them be recognized for their hard work."
