THURS - Thrift Shop Thursday - Dress tacky, wacky and wild FRI - SPIRIT DAY!!! Wear Maroon and White!!


All outfits must be school appropriate.

SOCIAL STUDIES 7TH GRADE

We are thrilled to announce that Mollie Watson,
Assistant Director of the Niles History Center, and
Erika Hartley, an Instructor at the Institute for
Intercultural and Anthropological Studies, will visit
Buchanan Middle School in mid-October. Hartley
is also the Field Director and Curatorial Fellow for
the Fort St. Joseph Archaeological Project,
researched by Western Michigan University.

Located on the banks of the St. Joseph River in Niles, Fort St. Joseph is a site rich with history and archaeological significance. Watson and Hartley will engage Mrs. Luke's 7th-grade Social Studies students in an exciting session, sharing insights into the life of an archaeologist and a museum director. They will also reveal fascinating archaeological finds made by WMU at Fort St. Joseph.

ELA 6TH GRADE

In 6th-grade English/Language Arts, BMS students wrote a short story using their five senses to focus on adding details to their writing.
